ICEBOX GALLERY presents:

A fun, new photography exhibit called “Highway 12 Revisited” will open on February 1, 7:00 – 10 PM, at the Icebox Gallery in NE Minneapolis.

Participants of the great Highway 12 Road Trip Photography Workshop experience were invited to submit images from recent and past workshops, choosing from any topic that inspired them on the trip. Under guidance of Icebox Gallery, a group of six former road-trippers volunteered to plan and execute the Highway 12 Revisited show.

Exhibit photos topics range from a barbershop to a county fair to local community members to hay rides and cemeteries.

Each July for over a decade, gallery owner, Howard Christopherson, has led the Highway 12 Road Trip Photography Workshop. 12 to 15 photographers of all skill levels, ages, genders, interests and camera choices, including one fellow who brought only his trusty iPad, travel US HWY 12 from Minneapolis to Lily, South Dakota, taking advantage of the opportunity to focus on developing their personal creative talents, spending quality time with like-minded individuals and just having a great time, rain or shine. The group stops at several sites along the way that are ripe with photographic opportunity, but Lily itself is, as they say, a photographers’ paradise. Basically a ghost town, Lily was established around 1883, but fell into ruin after the railroad spur line was closed in 1971. Many old buildings are still standing in various states of repair/disrepair and a few full-time residents are rumored to live there (But who knows. If they do, they keep to themselves.). The band of photographers spend the next two days scouting small towns and abandoned buildings, lakes and high plateau prairie looking for scenes and people to document. Renovated houses in Lily provide inexpensive overnight shelter for the photographers.

This year, Howard invited all recent and past “Road Trip” participants to submit up to 3 images taken during the workshops. A committee of 6 “Road Trippers” selected one image from each applicant for public display at Icebox. Each print was beautifully matted and framed by the gallery and some prints will be available for purchase.
